Abundis, C.J., delivered the opinion of the Board, in which Gandall K., Gerald Q., Naqvi K. and Bunda J. joined. Anayat T., took no part in the consideration or decision of the case.

Chief Justice Abundis delivered the unanimous opinion of the Judicial Board,

The three elections complaints received, *Lee v. Knight*, *Iqbal v. Knight*, and *Yang v. Knight* are herein combined in a single ruling, given that they address the same circumstance which is, the allegation that Candidate Knight's campaigned with a slate. The petitioners argue that such campaigning violated the rules established in a previous version of the ASUCI Elections Code Art. XIX § A, which states, "All candidates for the Student Advocate General position are banned from being a part of any slate or being affiliated with any slates." The Judicial Board holds that given the cited code is no longer in effect and no other code is in effect that prevents Student Advocate General candidates from campaigning in slates, no punitive measures shall be taken against Candidate Knight.

I.

As stipulated in other election complaint rulings emerging from the current elections season, the Judicial Board finds that there are no Election Codes currently binding the ASUCI elections.¹

Given that there are no elections codes in effect other that RONR, then it is only upon prohibited behavior banned or regulated in RONR that could result in punitive action to be taken for the behavior alleged by the petitioners. The Judicial Board determines that there is no prohibition for Student Advocate General candidates to participate in a slate in RONR, and so Mr. Knight's actions are not found punishable by the Judicial Board.

II.

As described in *Dang v. Mendez*, in cases such as these, where legal confusion due to the fault of the ASUCI government has misled students, students may not be punishable. As such, because it was ASUCI's fault in the lack of clarity of which Election Code was being enforced, Mr. Knight is not subject to punishment.

The Judicial Board rules as follows, upon the recommendation of the Elections Commissioner:
Mr. Knight, the subject of the submitted Elections Complaint is not to be punished for joining a slate.

It is so ordered.
